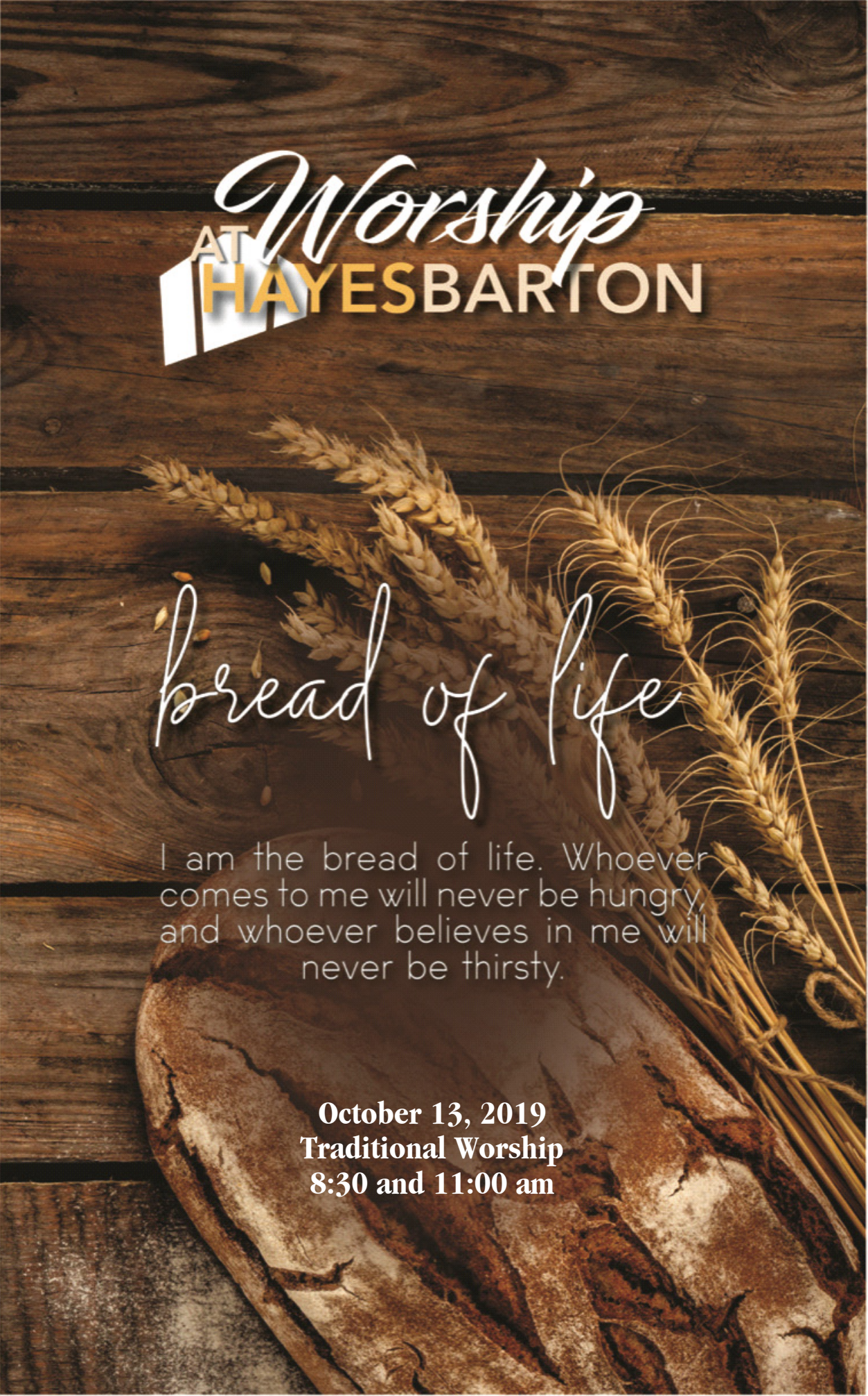
Worship is an integral part of Christian life at Hayes Barton.
